WHAT is 9-1-1?

(or what you probably already know)



9-1-1 is a number to call to get help



Fire, Medical or Police
Emergency



WHEN to call 9-1-1

 9-1-1 is for emergencies only

 Dial 9-1-1 if someone is hurt or in danger, or if you are in immediate need of police, fire or medical assistance



WHEN NOT to call

Don't call 9-1-1 just because you want directions to the nearest bathroom, your dog is in distress, or you forgot to pay your parking ticket.

Making prank calls to 9-1-1 is a very bad idea



The 9-1-1 center will know your callback number and your location.



You will be using up resources that are needed to help real people in real trouble.



It is **illegal** to call 911 when there is no crime or suspicious activity, and you and/or your **parents** will be responsible for your actions.



9-1-1 is not as cool as you are.

You can NOT text or IM
“9-1-1” to reach
emergency services.




For now you will need to make an

Pull over if driving

Know where you are

-  Try to be aware of your surroundings.
-  Don't know the street address?
Try to find landmarks.



Stay calm

 You are the only person who can tell the 9-1-1 center what is happening.

 Try not to panic. If you are crying or yelling, it can be hard for the 9-1-1 operator to understand you.



 Stay strong- pull yourself together answer the 9-1-1 operator's questions.



Never hang up



Let the 9-1-1 operator know what happened.



If you end the call abruptly we will assume that something has gone very wrong.



The 9-1-1 operator will tell you when its ok to hang up.



Good Samaritan Law

There is an exemption to the underage drinking law when you are seeking medical attention for another person:

You can be immune from prosecution for consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages

IF:



Good Samaritan Law


The only way law enforcement officers became aware of the person's violation is because the person placed a call in good faith with a reasonable belief that person was in danger and needed immediate attention to prevent death or serious injury.

AND:



Good Samaritan Law

The person reasonably believed he was the first person to make a call to report that another person needed immediate medical attention to prevent death or serious injury.



AND:

Good Samaritan Law

The person provided his own name to the 911 operator.



AND:

Good Samaritan Law

The person remained with the person needing medical assistance until emergency health care providers arrived and the need for his/her presence had ended.



Good Samaritan Law

Simply means that you can be exempt from prosecution for underage drinking IF

1. You feel another person is in danger,
2. You are the first person to make the call,
3. You provide your name,
4. AND you stay with the person until help arrives.
