

Hello. Thank you for all that you and your agency do to care for people in need, especially our pediatric patients. 2024 marks a unique opportunity for Pennsylvania EMS agencies and fire department QRS services to contribute to the readiness and capacity of pediatric care by participating in a nationwide quality improvement assessment, ensuring that EMS and fire-rescue agencies are ready to care for children. The **National Prehospital Pediatric Readiness Project (PPRP)** is for all 911 level EMS agencies and is designed to assess and support pediatric readiness through a series of survey questions and responses by your agency.

The PPRP survey website is https://EMSpedsReady.org

In the next few days, your agency contact will receive an email invitation from **EMSpedsReady@hsc.utah.edu**. Please follow the instructions on how to access and complete the survey. The online survey should take about 30-45 minutes to complete. Several questions require some pre-survey research while others require clarification specific to Pennsylvania as this is a national survey and variances exist between states. We have posted information on the **Pennsylvania EMSC website (www.paemsc.org)** regarding the survey including a downloadable paper version, a list of data you will need prior to completing the survey, and clarification on specific questions.

The survey period will run from May 1st through July 31st

We urge you to take the time to prepare before responding to the online version. Download the paper copy, identify your responses to the questions before going online to complete the actual survey. Collaborate with your leadership, medical director, and pediatric coordinator (if you have one) to identify your responses. Answer all questions honestly and within your agency's scope and actual practice when completing the survey. Responding to questions to gain a higher score does **NOT** help us assess needs and identify resources. *Paper submissions are not acceptable.*
